## Credit of trust

- just "try and do" to explore your skills and talents
- flat hierarchies encourage to try out things uncomplicated
  → help to discover your strengths and interests
- you are "taken by the hand", given trust and responsibility
- full and respected community member from day one
- your **opinions and contributions** do matter

## Friends around the globe

- open minded people have friends around the world
- you widen your view, redefine your own position and learn for life
- you **get to know foreign countries** in a different way: the mentality, the philosophy and the reality of life
- different people with different cultures, backgrounds, professions, age and languages
- **supposed barriers** often only exist in our heads
