Definition

Openwashing:

Creating the misleading impression of developing, offering or otherwise supporting Free Software, while actually offering proprietary software.

- 1. Proprietary software: software product is not (fully) Free Software
- 2. **Misleading communication**: The manufacturer gives the impression that this software is Free Software.


Openwashing is a form of fraudulent labelling – usually with the intention of gaining a market advantage for proprietary software products.





What is the FreeFileSync Business Edition?



In order to allow FreeFileSync in a commercial or government setting, it is required to license a number of devices for installation by using the form below.

After payment you are redirected to the download page of the FreeFileSync Business Edition (with additional features: 🏞 吨 🛛 💢 🖺) and an **invoice** is sent via email at the same time.

A license costs €20 per device and allows for unlimited use of the FreeFileSync Business Edition. This includes future software updates for one year. Email notifications (which create ongoing costs for the FreeFileSync project) are guaranteed only for the duration of the update period, although there are currently no plans to end service after that.

Methods & strategies

Open wording, closed code: misleading naming or buzzwording

Pseudo Open Licensing: Misleading licensing of proprietary software

Partly Open Proprietary Software: "Open Core" / proprietary "Enterprise Edition"

Obfuscated source: hidden proprietary components or blobs

Closed source forks: Free Software intransparently turned proprietary

Closed server: advertise free client, while server is proprietary

Delayed source: new features promoted as free but are proprietary (first)

Obstructed source: users are kept from exercising their freedoms

Pseudo-open AI: training data, model, weights, software – some or all not free



Why is openwashing a problem?

Free Software manufacturers: not awarded in procurement, loss of revenue

Free Software developers: loss of income, might face layoffs

Free Software community: mutual distrust

Free Software: reputational damage, problems attributed to Free Software

Public administrations: no control over digital infrastructures, no interoperability, ongoing vendor lock-in


General public: deceived about the sustainable use of taxpayers' money

The goals of 'Public money? Public code!' are undermined.

Damage to the Free Software ecosystem.



Maslow's Hammer



"If the only you have is a hammer, it is tempting to treat everything as if it were a nail."

Abraham Harold Maslow, The Psychology of Science: A Reconnaissance, 1966, S. 15.

These are not the only pitfalls in the procurement of Free Software.

Not every problematic behaviour of a bidding party has to do with openwashing.



Other pitfalls

Free Software becomes proprietary

Single vendor, lacking a community

Weak business model

Freeloading: Offering Free Software developed by others without payments or contributions

Vulnerable components as dependencies





What can public administrations do?

Reduce the risk of awarding contracts to openwashers:

Expertise, reliable structures + institutions, tender criteria, maintain the ability to change, willingness to learn

Avoid own openwashing:

Licensing criteria, REUSE, open development, compliance/inclusion in Linux distributions, multi-stakeholder participation, expertise



What can we all do?

Understand strategies and methods of openwashing / unfair competition

Avoid own openwashing

Raise awareness - talk about openwashing

Monitor markets and public administrations

Ask questions, educate, convince




Openwashing assumes there is a dishonest intention.

Sometimes there is no dishonest intention: it is our job to convince these actors that they need to play fair and fix their marketing.
